



# Screening, Brief Intervention, and Referral to Treatment (SBIRT) Training

Screening, Brief Intervention, and Referral to Treatment (SBIRT) is an integrated, public health approach to the delivery of early intervention and treatment services for persons with substance use disorders and those at risk of developing these disorders. SBIRT is an evidence-based training and will assist in identifying individuals with problems using or at risk for substance use disorders. This training incorporates screening for all types of substance use with brief, tailored feedback and advice. SBIRT is reimbursable - billing codes are available.

This training is a 4-hour model for primary care and behavioral health providers.
