100 Percent of P4R Withhold Pool Returned to PPS Partners

The AHI Board of Directors recently made the decision to return 100 percent of the accumulated DSRIP pay-for-reporting (P4R) withhold pool to AHI PPS partners. As a reminder, DSRIP project addenda include a 15-percent withhold on payment activities. This return represents more than \$665,000 in additional funds flow released to partners across the PPS, covering project activities paid between April 2017 and March 2018. This return will be the last withhold return as P4R contract addenda ended on March 30, 2018.



Through the DY3-2 payment received in August 2018, the PPS has been successful in earning approximately 86 percent of available DSRIP program revenue. AHI thanks our partners for working with us to achieve these results, which allowed for this withhold return determination.

Population Health Improvement Program Renewed



Adirondack Health Institute received word earlier this month that the NYS Department of Health is renewing its contract for the Population Health Improvement Program (PHIP) in the North Country region for an additional one-year period. The program works with communities throughout the North Country to identify, share, and help implement best practices and strategies to promote population health and reduce health

disparities. Originally slated to run for two years from January 15, 2015, to January 14, 2017, this is the second time the program has been extended by the DOH. The initiative is now scheduled to sunset on January 14, 2020.

AHI Health Home Expands to Saratoga County

The AHI Health Home Care Management program has expanded to add Saratoga County to its existing coverage area, joining Clinton, Essex, Franklin, Hamilton, St. Lawrence, Warren, and Washington counties. The program, a care management service that connects community and social services with health care, is partnering with the Transitional Services Association, Alliance for Positive Health, and Catholic Charities Care Coordination Services to provide services in the county. According to Ann Hutchison, Director, Care Management and Health Home, Adirondack Health Institute, AHI partners with 20 care management agencies, four managed care plans and the NYS Department of Health to provide care management services to children and adults enrolled in Medicaid in its eight-county region. "Care Managers help Medicaid members obtain access to services, provide advocacy, and help members navigate the complex waters of our health care system," explained Hutchison. "We are excited to serve the population in Saratoga County that would benefit from Health Home Care Management services. There is no cost to our members and making a referral is easy.
