Open Door Mission Receives \$1.5M Award for Expansion



As part of its 30th Anniversary, the <u>Open Door Mission</u> in Glens Falls recently announced they have been awarded a \$1.5 million grant from the <u>Federal Home Loan Bank of New York</u> and <u>Glens Falls National Bank and Trust Company</u>. Awarded through the FHLBNY's Competitive Affordable Housing Program, the organization will use the funding to help complete its comprehensive temporary housing development project. The project will provide shelter with wrap-around support services for men in times of transition, in addition to

Open Door's LifePath program of daily services for men and women. It will include an emergency shelter for 50 men, a job-resource computer lab, a medical clinic, and offices for partner organizations.

Important Information




equates to one in five deaths annually, or more than 1,300 deaths every day in the country.
