



Clear the Air in the Southern Adirondacks

Tobacco control programs like *Clear The Air In The Southern Adirondacks (CASA)* play a crucial role in the prevention of many chronic conditions such as cancer, heart disease, and respiratory illness. Comprehensive tobacco prevention and cessation programs prevent youth from smoking, help individuals to quit smoking, and serve as a counter to the negative influence of the tobacco industry. CASA supports community businesses, municipalities, housing complexes, and more to implement smoke-free policies on their grounds and at their events.

A component of CASA, Reality Check, is a youth led, adult supported program for students interested in making a difference in the tobacco industry and in their communities. Involved youth lead positive change through educational approaches to business leaders, legislators, and community entities. Major efforts focus on reducing tobacco marketing for teens, eliminating tobacco imagery in youth-rated movies, and helping shape a tobacco-free landscape for future generations.

Through support from the NYS DOH Bureau of Tobacco Control and the Advancing Tobacco-Free Communities program, AHI's CASA program supports smoke-free initiatives across Saratoga, Warren, and Washington Counties. E-mail casa@ahihealth.org to collaborate!



Health Home Care Management

AHI's Health Home provides care management services to individuals with complex health needs who are recipients of Medicaid.

- A Care Manager provides access to health and social services to individuals to assure that they stay healthy and reduce avoidable emergency department visits and inpatient hospitalizations.
- Health records are shared among an individual's providers to avoid service duplication or neglection.
- Health Home services create continuity throughout a network of organizations including medical and clinical providers, health plans, and community-based organizations; collective consideration of these services creates a "Health Home."





Behavioral Health

- •Integrate primary care and behavioral health services
- Raise awareness of behavioral health to promote prevention, early intervention & treatment
- •Enhance/promote evidence-based prevention programs/policies to reduce substance misuse

Technology/ Telemedicine

- •Link providers to electronic medical records through HIE
- Gather and analyze clinical data & claims to improve quality and reduce costs

- Connects entities to broadband telecommunications/telemedicine network

North Country Telehealth Partnership


- Collaboration with Adirondack Health Institute (AHI)
