
Hospice Care Model

A note on Palliative Care




Palliative Care is holistic healthcare aimed at relieving the burden of the disease, it is not curative

All Hospice care is Palliative Care but not all Palliative Care is Hospice Care

Impact of Our Hospices across the North Country

- An area that includes more than 1.4 million people and covers 42% of the state's land mass
- Compared to New York State as a whole, our territory has a higher percentage:
 - Adults over 65 (20.06% vs 18.10%),
 - Individuals classified as disabled (16% vs 12.9%)
 - Veterans (7.69% vs 3.7%).
 - These populations have unique needs and generally experience higher utilization rates within the healthcare system.
- In 2023, our hospices combined served:
 - o more than 3,100 hospice patients and their families in private homes and skilled nursing facilities,
 - o 194 patients in hospice residences
 - more than 400 home-based palliative care patients.
- The quality of our services is evidenced by our average Patient Satisfaction Scores across the eight reported measures:
 - O GOE IPA Members (87%)
 - New York State average (83%)
 - United States average (81.5%)

Why We Started:

- Challenges:
 - Regulatory Concerns
 - Insurance Reimbursement
 - Staffing
 - Financial Challenges
 - Sustainability
- Deep Commitment to Local Communities
 - Preservation of Community Hospice Services
- Like-minded Mission-driven Partners



How We Started:

- Informal activities & interactions:
 - Conversations at state organization and other meetings
 - Collaboration of some partners with work/staff (billing, QA, on-call triage)
 - Complaining in the bar
 - Made a conscious decision to consider what could be different/better
- Started formally meeting as a group electronically in 2021

We walked through our organizations' staffing to identify strengths, struggles, and everything in between.



Critical Steps:

- Obtain buy-in of each participating hospice's Board of Directors
 - O Initial
 - O Ongoing
- Hire an Attorney!
- Proactive, Open Communication with DOH

Creation of the GOE IPA – Steps Completed:

- Determined IPA Governance Structure
 - Board of Directors/Officers
 - o Bylaws
 - Certificate of Incorporation
- Obtained approvals from DOH, SED & DFS
- Adopted Capital Certificates
- Adopted Membership Certificates
- Held Initial Meeting of the Board of Directors




Ongoing Work:
